JOY IN HUMILITY

as you GO

These are simple questions to ask your students as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- .01** What qualities do your closest friends have in common? Why are these qualities important to you?
- .02** What does it mean to be humble? Who are the most humble people you know? What makes them humble?

family DEVOTION

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

summary: PHILIPPIANS 2:1-13

In this session, Paul encouraged the church in Philippi to be united in thought, love, spirit, and purpose. He reminded them that Jesus, who is fully God, humbled Himself by taking on human flesh. In so doing, Jesus demonstrated love for us in the most profound way. By humbling Himself in order to serve us and save us, Jesus gives us a picture of how we should love and serve our friends. Followers of Jesus find joy in following His example of humility in their relationships.

discussion QUESTIONS

- .01** Why did Paul say that we should consider other people more important than we are? How can students your age do this?
- .02** How did Christ demonstrate humility? What does it look for us to follow His example in our daily lives?

PRAY: Ask God to show us how we can be more humble. Ask Him to point us toward opportunities to love and serve others the way Jesus did.
